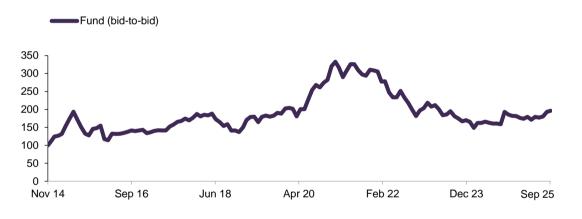

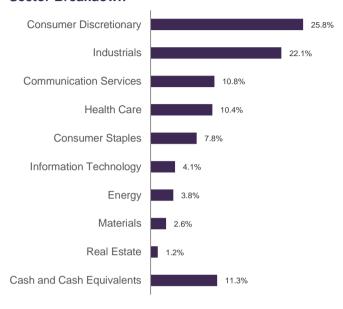

Market Review

Global stock markets performed well in September, with A-shares, Hong Kong stocks, and U.S. stocks all recording positive returns. The MSCI China Index rose by 9.5%, significantly outperforming the MSCI World Index, which gained 3.3%, and the MSCI Emerging Markets Index, which rose by 7.2%. Nearly all sectors achieved positive returns this month, with consumer discretionary, materials, and telecommunications indices showing significant gains of 20.3%, 16.4%, and 11.8%, respectively. The information technology, telecommunications services, and consumer staples indices also posted solid returns, while the financial index experienced a decline of 2.9%.

Domestically, major events such as the 25th meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization Heads of State Council and the 80th anniversary parade commemorating the victory of the Chinese people in the War of Resistance against Japanese Aggression and the World Anti-Fascist War (the "September 3 Parade") were grandly held, with China engaging in talks with leaders from multiple countries. Internationally, U.S. non-farm payroll data fell short of expectations, and the Federal Reserve lowered interest rates by 25 basis points as anticipated, bringing the federal funds rate down to 4.00%-4.25%—the first rate cut of the year and the resumption of rate cuts after nine months. The Sino-U.S. economic and trade teams held talks in Madrid and reached a basic framework consensus on resolving issues related to TikTok, reducing investment barriers, and promoting economic and trade cooperation. It is expected that the leaders of China and the U.S. will meet at the APEC summit at the end of October and plan to visit each other in early next year. Additionally, U.S. tariff disruptions have resurfaced, with President Trump announcing a 100% tariff on all imported brand-name or patented drugs, effective October 1, and a 25% tariff on heavy trucks produced outside the U.S.

China's economy is stabilizing and improving, with both domestic and foreign investment institutions raising their growth expectations for China's economy for the year. Regarding prices, the August CPI fell by 0.4% year-on-year, while the PPI dropped by 2.9%, with the decline narrowing compared to previous years. In September, the manufacturing PMI reached 49.8, still below the neutral line, with industrial output growing by 5.2% year-on-year. Cement and electricity production decreased by 6.2% and 1.6% year-on-year, respectively, showing a slight slowdown in growth.

On the investment side, fixed asset investment grew by 0.5% year-on-year, with infrastructure investment up by 2.0%. However, real estate investment decreased by 13.2%, indicating a slowdown in investment growth. The real estate market remains weak, with the average residential price in 70 cities falling by 2.95% year-on-year, although the decline has slightly narrowed. New home sales saw a cumulative year-on-year decline of 7.3%, with further expansion in the drop, suggesting that stabilizing the property market may still require policy support. The ten-year bond yield has started to rise, reaching 1.87% by the end of August, while the USD/CNY exchange rate was 7.11, with the yuan appreciating slightly.

Investment Strategy

Regarding investment strategies, we continue to focus on stock selection from a company value perspective, emphasizing cash flow generation capabilities. We have selectively allocated quality companies across various industries. During the interim reporting period in August, most of the stocks in our portfolio performed well, meeting our expectations. Moving forward, we will moderately adjust our holdings based on individual stock performance and changes in fundamentals. Looking ahead, our investment portfolio will maintain a value style as the core allocation, focusing on high-quality companies with solid moats and sufficient safety margins, while selectively allocating to assets with prominent growth characteristics, aiming for better long-term investment returns.
